

IPC S. 201, 302 – In a case of direct evidence, motive would not be relevant, in a case of circumstantial evidence, motive plays an important link to complete the chain of circumstances – Circumstances on record do not make a complete chain to dispel any hypothesis of innocence of the appellant – Acquitted



Indian Penal Code, 1860 – S.201, S.302 – Prosecution had not alleged any motive on part of the appellant to commit murder of the deceased – Though in a case of direct <u>evidence</u>, motive would not be relevant, in a case of circumstantial evidence, motive plays an important link to complete the chain of circumstances...
